Little did I know that she watered and nurtured a seed in me that I didn't even know was there and which grew into my own love of gardening today. This mutual love of plants and gardening actually came full circle in the few months right before she passed. Donna and I continued our friendship after she left DuPont, mainly through several Bible studies, first in my home, then at her church in LaPlace, and most recently at the home of mutual friends. And she and the ladies of her church always loved to attend the St. James Community Church Ladies' Tea held at my church in Paulina every year.

Throughout all these years my experience of Donna is that she had a smile and a kind word for everyone, and there always seemed to be a cheerful peace in the room when she was present. I'm so grateful that my relationship with Donna grew closer when she was going through chemo and my husband was having surgery earlier this year. We would check on each other, and she would spontaneously bring a plant that she'd nurtured and repotted, and I would share with her the bounty from my vegetable garden. It was during one of these "dropoffs" that she suggested that maybe we could meet outside to visit longer with "social distancing" since Louisiana was in pandemic shutdown mode. The spring weather was cool and beautiful so I suggested that she come over to our house since the flowers were in bloom, and it was nice and shady in the yard in the late afternoon. So my husband and I got to enjoy several of these outdoor visits with Donna in our beautiful garden, the seeds of which she had helped to sow in me so many years ago. I don't think that I got to share this with her because I don't think I even realized it until I was writing this memorial to her life and what she meant to me.

*believe that God granted her prayer that she shared with me that last Monday that she hoped she wouldn't suffer very long.
