



## Lloyd Phillip Templet

January 24, 1939 - April 29, 2024

Lloyd Phillip Templet, a lifelong resident of Reserve passed away Monday, April 29, 2024, at the age of 85, surrounded by his loving family. A loving husband, father, grandfather, uncle, and son, a skilled craftsman, and a proud veteran of the United States Army, Lloyd's life was a testament to his dedication to his country and his loved ones.

Born to George Paul and Marie Therese (Jacob) Templet, Lloyd was known for his kindness and strong sense of duty. He graduated from Leon Godchaux High School in 1958 and, in 1962 through 1964 served his country in the United States Army, where he was honorably discharged with the rank of Specialist 4th Class exemplifying his commitment and patriotism.

After his service, Lloyd's path crossed with Mae at a dance, marking the beginning of a lifelong partnership filled with love and shared joys, especially their mutual love for dancing. They married on a chilly day in January 1966, their wedding dance a memorable moment that symbolized their warmth and unity even in the coldest of times.

and Rylee Moore. Known affectionately as Caw-caw to Emma and PaPaw to Landon and Noah, his role as a grandfather was filled with love, laughter, and invaluable life lessons. He also leaves behind numerous nieces and nephews and his sister Dianna Deslatte (David). Preceded in death by his siblings Walter Templet of Norco, Rosalie Templet and Gary Templet of Reserve.

A master of woodworking, Lloyd's artistic and technical talents were admired by many and shared with many as gifts. His work stands as a testament to his skill, precision, and passion for craftsmanship.

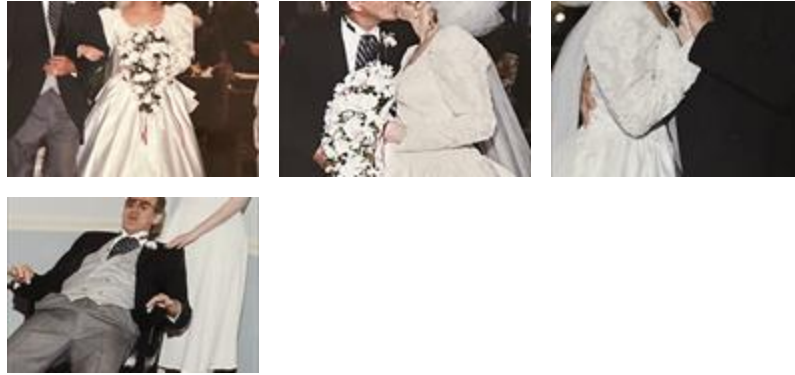

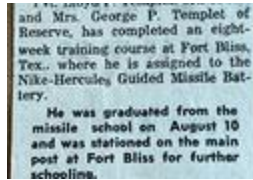
